# Lovely Feedback from a National Leader of Education

It is always refreshing to hear positive things about our school, the staff and our children, from 'outside eyes'. Recently we have had a set of visits from Mrs Elaine Watson, who is a National Leader of Education. In her most recent visit, we asked her to look at how we have implemented the new phonics scheme and how we teach early reading.

Her feedback was extremely positive, commenting on things like:

- A consistent approach was evident in the lesson observations, with the ELS (Phonics) scheme fully embedded across Early Years and KS1.
- The English leader and class teachers know pupils extremely well. The English Leader is knowledgeable and monitors progress of the children needing additional support to catch up, liaising with class teachers to check that appropriate provision is in place.
- The school has historic high attainment in phonics and the school has continued to exceed national figures.

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I think the nicest comment she made as her visits come to an end, was one she expressed to myself, Mr Allen and Mrs Barlow as we discussed her time with us. In an effort to sum up what she felt about our school she said: 'I think the acid test about a school is whether you would want to send your own children to it. Would I send my child here? Absolutely I would!' Lovely to hear!
