PTFA Disco

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, the PTFA put together a provisional plan for the rest of the term and beyond. Their first event will be a children's disco on Thursday 23rd February. It will be run in a similar way to others they have done recently. Infants and juniors will have a separate disco, so that there's enough room in the hall. The infants will run from home time until 4.15, with the juniors getting their turn after that until 5.30. All children will receive a drink and a snack as part of the ticket price. So that juniors do not have to go home and come back, or infants with a junior sibling can wait for them, there will also be an option for children to stay at school from 3.15 to 5.30 without having to leave. There will be a room or two set up to keep children occupied when it is not their turn. Tickets will go on sale next week. It will be £3 for the disco only, or £5 to stay at school until 5.30.
