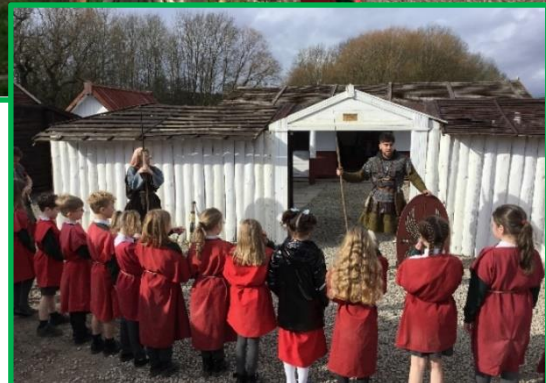


Class 3 Invade York!

They are already eating and moving around the enclosure. The class look forward to watching them grow next week.

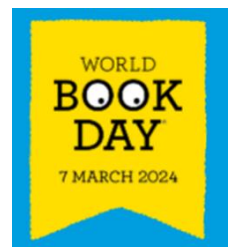


World Book Day – 7th March

A Polite Reminder about our Dress Code

I am noticing several children who are 'pushing boundaries' a little with our dress code. I thought that I would remind everyone about a few things.

- Please send children to school in **plain black school shoes**. **Not trainers, or shoes that are not plain black**. We are always understanding about the odd situation where this may not be possible, but please do not send children to school in 'non uniform' items consistently.
- Children should **NOT wear any jewellery** except simple, plain earrings. No bracelets (including any sort of wrist bands), necklaces or rings.
- Children should **NOT have nail varnish on**.
- **Infant children should have a book bag** to fetch and carry things to and from school, not a rucksack etc. I also can't see a reason why juniors bring a large bag with next to nothing in it. They just get in the way and make lockers difficult to close.
- **No pencil cases** or writing/drawing equipment to be brought to school. They just cause fuss.

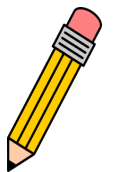
