#### A Collector's Item of a Newsletter

Welcome to a very special edition of our weekly newsletter. Not only is it unusual as it is coming out on a Thursday (because of tomorrow's training day), it is also dated 29th February! To make it even MORE unusual, we are making this a PTFA special. Read on to find out more.

#### An Introduction to the PTFA

The PTFA (Parents, Teachers and Friends Association) are a registered charity that works to support the school. They do this in two main ways. Firstly, they organise social events that are designed to give our children (and often their families) a bit of fun and enjoyment. Secondly, they raise much needed funds for the school, to spend as they see fit on projects that help the school go 'above and beyond' what it could normally do. Quite often the two things combine and they raise funds whilst organising social events.

A good example of that was the Christmas Fair. This year we held a fair that was well attended by families and that had lots of enjoyable games and stalls to take part in. Father Christmas came along, children had their faces painted, and much fun was had by all. At the end of the

event, the PTFA had raised over £2000 (including money taken by the raffle).

So, they are a small group of staff, parents, family and friends who fulfil a very important role in school. To do this they hold meetings every few weeks on an evening. They are currently held at The Hollins Mill in Sowerby Bridge and we always advertise them on the newsletter. Everyone is welcome to attend.



Over the years, the PTFA have raised many thousands of pounds to help with projects around school. One ongoing commitment they have is to contribute to the school minibuses that we lease. These vehicles allow

our school to take children out and about at very reasonable cost to families. They are a real asset to school, but one that we would struggle to finance without the support of the PTFA.

They also fund one off projects. In the recent past, they have provided the Reception Class with an outdoor shelter that children use throughout the year. They have bought the raised flower/vegetable beds in the main playground that children plant and grow things in. They funded the playground markings that our children use to stimulate games and activities. The list goes on.

Most recently, they have supported our School Council's mission to provide a quiet, reflective space outside. This has included fencing off the area and buying our lovely 'Christian Values Bench' for children to sit and chat on.

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# What are the PTFA Supporting Currently

The PTFA are continuing to support the School Council's wishes to develop the quiet area of the playground. The next steps include making the area accessible all year round by changing the surface, providing extra seating and some shade. Our School Council are very grateful of their support and are looking forward to seeing some of these things begin during Easter.

#### The PTFA Events this Term

Hopefully you will have seen a previous newsletter with the events our PTFA are organising. They begin next week with the Mothers' Day Secret Shop. They are also organising an Easter Egg Hunt for the final day before we break up for the holidays. More details

about this event will follow.

Looking beyond and into the Summer term, they plan to hold the disco that got postponed due to the snow, as well as arrange a summer event that still needs to be finalised. This could be a talent show, or perhaps something that ties in with the Olympics.



So, that's a bit about our PTFA, how they help and what they are planning. However, their issue can be troops on the ground. Some events (the Christmas fair for example) simply cannot run without lots of help. This year it nearly didn't, and some games and stalls were abandoned

because there wasn't enough people to run them! It would be a travesty if our school could not drum up enough support to hold events like that.

As a charity, there are named members of the PTFA, but **anyone is welcome** to come to the meetings

where ideas are generated, dates are set and decisions about financially supporting projects are made. If meetings aren't your thing, there's a WhatsApp group that provides a group of people that are willing to help at events as and when they can. Please consider putting yourself down to be part of that group.

#### **Rotakids Sock Puppet Competition**

#### HOW TO MAKE A SOCK PUPPET

- Turn the sock inside out.

- Stitch or stick on the face to whatever design you like.
- · Some suggestions: Chick, hen, Easter bunny, spring flowers, cracked egg, chocolate egg or a lamb.
- Write your name clearly inside the sock.

Great stuff!


#### World Book Day – 7<sup>th</sup> March
