Year 1 Phonics Screening Checks

Next week, our Year 1 children will be taking part in the national Phonics Screening Check. This is a short, one-to-one assessment that helps us understand how well your child is progressing with their phonics—an essential part of early reading development.

The check involves your child reading a list of 40 words, some of which are real and some "nonsense" (made-up) words. This allows us to see how well they can apply their phonics knowledge to decode unfamiliar words, which is a key skill in learning to read. The check is carried out in a quiet, familiar environment with a trusted adult and is designed to feel as relaxed and low-pressure as possible for the children. Your child's results will be communicated to you as part of their end of year report.

Year 4 Multiplication Checks

This week and next week, our Year 4 pupils will be completing the statutory Multiplication Tables Check. Schools are given a two-week window to carry out these short online assessments, which are designed to assess how confidently children can recall their times tables up to 12×12 .

At our school, we choose to make use of the full two-week period. This flexible approach allows us to create a calm and supportive environment, giving each child the best chance to feel prepared and confident. It also enables staff to provide any final bits of encouragement or targeted support where needed—something we know makes a difference. To help pupils feel as relaxed as possible, the checks will be completed in school with a familiar adult.

Transition Arrangements for Next Year

As we approach the final weeks of the school year, our thoughts are turning to transition and ensuring that every child feels prepared and supported as they move into their new year group in September. While many schools offer a single transition morning or afternoon, we have found that a period of extended transition is far more beneficial for our pupils. That's why we have planned a series of transition sessions over the coming weeks:

- Tuesday 24th June (morning)
- Friday 4th July (morning)
- Thursday 10th July (afternoon)

Further details about support staff arrangements will be shared in an upcoming newsletter in the next few weeks.



These sessions allow children to build familiarity gradually, with new routines, new classrooms and new adults, so that by the time September arrives, the change feels natural and not overwhelming. These opportunities also give teachers the chance to observe and get to know their future class in a relaxed, supportive way. To further support this, our teaching staff dedicate a Twilight INSET (after-school training session) solely to transition. This session is used for a comprehensive handover between current and next year's teachers, sharing everything from academic progress to friendship dynamics and individual needs. However, as a small school, we're lucky to go well beyond this. Our teachers work closely together all year and speak informally, almost daily, about the children. This means that your child's next teacher often already knows them well before transition even begins.

For a small number of children, a more personalised transition is needed and we absolutely recognise and support this. For those who may benefit, we offer additional visits to their new classroom, 1:1 time with a key adult, or quiet conversations about what to expect. Because we are a small school, we often know each child incredibly well, sometimes even before they step into their new classroom, so we're able to tailor support that truly fits. Ultimately, our size is our strength. Relationships are at the heart of everything we do and transition is no different. By the time September arrives, we want every child to feel not just ready, but excited to begin the new year.
