


Sensory Room Update

I am delighted to share that our new sensory room installation has been scheduled for the week commencing 20th October. This means it will be fully operational and ready for our children to enjoy after the half-term break. This project has been 12 months in the making, from visiting other schools, meeting with specialist companies and working hard on funding bids- it is wonderful to see it finally becoming a reality.

As you know, school funding from the Local Authority does not typically cover projects of this kind. We are therefore especially grateful to our PTFA, the Sowerby Bridge Rotary Club Association and The Crossley and Porter Foundation, who together with additional fundraising have generously contributed £4,250 to make this possible. Without their support, this project simply would not have gone ahead. I look forward to sharing photographs of this fantastic new space with you very soon and even more so, to seeing the positive impact it will have on our children.





TESCO Blue Chip Tokens

We are so close to the finish line with our sensory room project – but we need one last push to secure up to £1,500 of vital funding. This final amount will make all the difference in completing the space and ensuring our children get the very best from it.

Severe Allergies in School - Be Aware

We need to remind all parents, carers, pupils, staff, and visitors that our school has children and staff with severe, life-threatening allergies. For their safety, it is absolutely essential that the following items are not brought into school under any circumstances:

- Strawberries (fresh, dried, or in any product containing strawberries)
- Nuts (of any type, including products containing nuts or nut oils)

Even the smallest trace of these allergens can cause a serious allergic reaction. This applies to all snacks, lunchboxes, treats for birthdays and any food brought into school. We kindly ask everyone to check ingredients carefully before sending food in. If a product contains, or even "may contain" strawberries or nuts, it must not be brought into school.

By following this rule strictly, we can keep everyone safe.
