Parent Information Evening

A huge thank you to all the parents, families and children who joined us for this year's Information Evening. As you know, we chose to structure the evening a little differently this time, as attendance in recent years had been gradually declining. We wanted to create an event that felt more interactive and engaging for everyone who came along.

Walking around the school, it was wonderful to see so many families actively involved in the classrooms. Parents and carers were working side-by-side with the children, exploring learning activities, speaking with staff and gaining a deeper insight into the day-to-day experiences of school life. The atmosphere was warm and collaborative, and it was a joy to see such positive engagement across all year groups.

We were delighted to receive a wealth of feedback following the event, both encouraging and constructive. Your comments are invaluable in helping us continue to develop and improve what we offer. A snapshot of this feedback can be found below:

I found the previous information evening more helpful and informative. I would have preferred more structure and conversation with the teacher / opportunities to hear more about the learning objectives and activities, not just see an example.



All of the feedback we gathered, both the snapshot shared above and the additional comments we have saved, will play an important role in helping us plan next year's event. Interestingly, when parents were asked whether they preferred this year's format or last year's, the results came back perfectly split at 50/50! Looking across the year groups, there were no clear trends either, with responses almost evenly divided in every class.

What this tells us is that next year's event will most likely need to bring together the best of both approaches: offering a little more structure and direct information sharing, while still providing opportunities for families to interact and engage alongside the children. We know it's impossible to create an evening that suits everyone perfectly, but we will certainly give it our best effort.



Staffing in the office

I am delighted to announce that, following a thorough interview process this week, we have appointed a new School Administrative Assistant. Miss Caitlan Neale will be joining our school next week and will initially work alongside both Sally and Michelle in the office before taking up the role in full the following week.

Caitlan brings with her a wealth of experience from working in a busy school office and I am confident she will be a wonderful addition to our team. I am sure you will give her the warmest of welcomes to our school community.

Attendance

I'm happy to share that attendance for the first three weeks of term is an excellent 98.8%, compared with 97% at the same time last year. This is a fantastic start and reflects your commitment to ensuring children are in school and ready to learn - thank you.

As we head into the colder months, seasonal illnesses are more common, so I'd like to remind you of our absence procedures:

Reporting absence: Please contact the office on the first day of absence by phone, email, or voicemail. Include your child's name, class and reason. If your child remains unwell, we ask you to repeat this each day.

Sickness/diarrhoea: Children must stay off school for 48 hours after the last episode, in line with NHS guidance. This prevents the spread of infection.

First Day Calling: Registers close at 8:50am. If your child is absent and we haven't heard from you, you'll receive a text and must respond before 9:10am. Following this, the office will begin making contact (following the contacts sheet). If we cannot make contact, the matter will be passed to myself or the Deputy Headteacher and may lead to further action (such as contacting MAST or a home visit).

These procedures are in place to safeguard all children and your support in following them is greatly appreciated.

Although we have a rolling start to the day, with doors open from 8:40am and registers closing at 8:50am, those ten minutes are incredibly valuable. For our younger children, they provide a calm and gentle start, helping them to settle and feel ready for the day ahead. For our older pupils, learning begins straight away at 8:40am with Early Bird Maths and English tasks, making every minute count. Arriving promptly means your child makes the very best start to their school day.
